
#### 2/ In Details

- On Mar 01, US CENTCOM report the Houthis launched one ASBM from Yemen into the Red Sea. There was no impact or damage to any vessels.
- On Mar 02, Italian Ministry of Defense reported that IT warship shot down 1 UAV in Red Sea.
- On Mar 02, US CENTCOM reported MV Rubymar, a Belize-flagged bulk carrier sank in the Red Sea after being struck by anti-ship ballistic missile on Feb 18.
- On Mar 03, Houthis launched an ASBM from Yemen territory with impact in position 1453N,04204E, 10 Nm from a US Warship.
- On Mar 04, a merchant vessel reported 1 explosion 750 meters approximately of the port quarter, and 1 explosion on the starboard side of the bridge. Casualties unknown, crew relocating to the citadel.
- On Mar 05, between the hours of 05 1200 UTC and 05 1400 UTC, CENTCOM forces shot down one ASBM and three OWA UAS launched from Houthi controlled areas of Yemen toward US WARSHIP in the Red Sea. There are no injuries or damage to the ship.
- On Mar 05, according to MSCHOA at 1420 UTC, a merchant vessel reported being suspiciously approached in position 2102N, 06154E (east of the coast of Oman). The vessel observed suspicious behavior by a fast craft and increased its speed to maximum. Nevertheless, it was pursued for almost an hour by the fast craft which only ceased pursuit after nightfall.
- On Mar 06, according to UKMTO at 06 0001 UTC, MV TRUE CONFIDENCE was hailed over VHF for 30 minutes, by an entity declaring itself to be the Yemeni Navy, ordering the merchant vessel to alter course, in the vicinity of 50 nm SW of Aden. According to MSCHOA at 0840 UTC, MV TRUE CONFIDENCE was under attack in position 1149N, 04438E. The merchant vessel was reportedly attacked, probably by missiles, about 54 nm SW of Aden, Yemen. Coalition warships contributed to the rescue and salvage operation. Some of the crew were evacuated in lifeboats. The missile attack, resulted in three fatalities, four injuries and significant damage to the ship. The crew abandoned the ship and coalition warships, including Indian warship KOLKATA responded in supporting the evacuation. In the evening of Mar 06, the bulk carrier was reported adrift with ongoing fire onboard.
- On Mar 07, USCENTCOM forces shot down three UAV launched from Houthi-controlled areas of Yemen toward the Gulf of Aden.
- On Mar 08, at 08 1314 UTC, 2 ASBM were launched from Houthi-controlled areas of Yemen toward a merchant ship, while been 50 nm South Southeast of Aden (120442N 0452306E). The vessel, reported two explosion 200 meters from the starboard of the vessel. Vessel was not hit; vessel and crew are reported as safe and are proceeding to the next port of call.
- On Mar 09, between 09 0101 UTC and 09 0339 UTC, FRA Warship and aircraft shot down 4 OWA UAV, launched from Houthi controlled areas of Yemen toward the Red Sea and Golf of Aden.
- On Mar 09, between 09 0100 UTC and 09 0520 UTC, US & Coalition Warships and aircrafts shot down 28 OWA UAV, launched from Houthi controlled areas of Yemen toward the Red Sea and Golf of Aden.






#### 3/Attack Heat Map











#### 6/Assessment

#### Most probable scenario - updated on 11 Mar 2024

Houthis intent was to target "Israeli-linked" ships, and they have extended their list of targets, as a result of the airstrikes conducted by the United States and the United Kingdom starting 11th January, to include U.S. and UK-affiliated vessels.

The increasing number of ships being targeted, with no apparent evidence of a link with any of these countries, underscores the notion that any ship is susceptible to Houthi targeting. Additionally, there are indications that the Houthis might be based on outdated information regarding ship ownership in certain instances.

Houthis' attack is expected to predominantly involve UAVs and missiles without exclude the use of USVs or even other aerial assets besides UAVs. The attack sequence may commence with a VHF communication instructing the vessel to alter its course towards a harbor under Houthi control. Failure to comply could result in a kinetic assault **as in the MV TRUE CONFIDENCE attack**. The direct boarding attempts, observed in previous instances, might not be repeated, given the robust U.S. kinetic response and the robust presence of EUNAVFOR ASPIDES. Nevertheless, the resurgence of skiffs harassing merchant navy ships in the vicinity of the BAM indicates a potential resurgence of the boarding approach.

UAV and missile attacks occur along the primary navigation route off the coast of Yemen, spanning the South Red Sea and the Bab el Mandeb (BAM). In recent days, the Gulf of Aden has become a focal point for such attacks and will probably remain so. Skiff harassment will predominantly concentrated in the vicinity of the BAM.





### Recommendations - updated on 11 Mar 2024

The following recommendations are based on the current situation and may not guarantee success. These suggestions will be updated as necessary.

Ships sailing off the Yemen coast in the Red Sea and West GOA:

- Register with MSCHOA (Maritime Security Centre Horn of Africa mschoa.org)
- Taking into account the risk balance between Safety and Security, consider minimizing information in the AIS data fields or have it switched off.
- Prefer night transit in the South Red Sea to avoid identification by skiffs or other supporting assets.
- Choose routes far from the Yemeni coast (particularly avoiding the traffic separation scheme east of the Hanish Islands) and make a wide detour around the southern islands of the Red Sea.
- Only essential crew should remain on the navigation deck.
- Crewmembers should stay as far away as possible from the outside walls of the ship.
- o Conduct drills onboard prior reaching the Yemen coasts.
- Utilize random alternation of speed and heading, to evade potential attacks, insofar as safety allows.
- Update and sanitize registered ownership, management and operator data available in vessel-tracking services available to the public.
- $\circ$   $\,$  Consider ballasting, taking into account protection and speed considerations.
- Drill ISPS system in SSAS mode.

For U.S. flag and U.S. owned commercial vessels:

US CENTCOM recommends that U.S. flag and U.S. owned commercial vessels remain North of 18N in the Red Sea or East of 46E in the Gulf of Aden until further notice. There continues to be a high degree of risk to commercial vessels transiting the Southern Red Sea between 12N and 16N. (ref. US Maritime Alert 2024-001B).
